Citrix President and CEO to be Featured Speaker at Broward Alliance Quarterly Meeting and Luncheon

Mark Templeton, President and CEO of Fort Lauderdale based Citrix Systems, Inc., will be the featured speaker at The Broward Alliance Quarterly Meeting and Luncheon on September 4th. The sold out event will be held from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the Renaissance Fort Lauderdale-Plantation, 1230 S. Pine Island Road in Plantation. The Broward Alliance will also be presenting its annual outstanding economic development leadership awards.

Teva Pharmaceutical Adding Jobs in Weston

Israel-based Teva Pharmaceutical Industries Ltd. will be bringing approximately 50 new jobs to a 19,000-square-foot space in Weston by the end of September. The employees will work in areas such as engineering, information technology and purchasing.

Medical Company Expanding in Fort Lauderdale

OrbusNeich plans to hire dozens of people in Fort Lauderdale as it ramps up clinical trials for its heart stents according to a recent article in the South Florida Business Journal. The Hong Kong-based company, which conducts research and development in Fort Lauderdale, uses technology developed by a Miami cardiologist. The company plans to boost its sales force and clinical team in Fort Lauderdale as it seeks approval for its stent, known as the Blazer where it's available overseas. The company expects to hire 150 to 200 people in the U.S. over the next two years, with half of them in Fort Lauderdale. It has 40 employees in Fort Lauderdale now.

South Florida Exports Up Again

South Florida's foreign exports are up by 44 percent from May 2006 to May 2008. Trade data compiled by the U.S. Census Bureau shows exports increased from \$3.2 billion in May 2006 to \$4.6 billion in May 2008. The data was taken from the tri-county area's six major airports and seaports: Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport, Port Everglades, Miami International Airport, the Port of Miami, Palm Beach International Airport and the Port of Palm Beach. South Florida's 21 percent year-to-date export gain is slightly outpacing the U.S. as a whole. From January through May 2008, U.S. aggregate exports rose 18 percent compared to the same time last year.

OneBroward Releases RFP For Groundbreaking Technology Project

On August 1, OneBroward, a community non-profit consortium consisting of Broward County Public Schools, Broward College (formerly BCC), the Broward Sheriff's Office (BSO), Florida Atlantic University, Memorial Hospital District, Nova Southeastern University and local government and health departments, released an RFP (Request for Proposal) for a

community-owned wired and wireless broadband network spanning 500 square miles of Broward county.

The network will greatly enhance services offered to county citizens by improving public safety and law enforcement, enabling local government efficiencies, providing digital inclusion for under-served communities and establishing an entrepreneurial-friendly environment that promotes economic development.

"The process of bringing eight large entities together in the interest of providing a broadband network solution to benefit the entire community has been ongoing and challenging, yet exciting," says Dr. Phyllis Schiffer-Simon, leader of the OneBroward organization and Director of BECON, Broward County Public Schools' television station. "OneBroward has the potential to make Broward county one of the first broadband networks in the world that incorporates members' existing assets to provide network applications that offer enhanced security and digital inclusion, with the potential of significant cost savings." OneBroward will become one of the largest networks of its kind in the country.

Broward County Public Schools to Host Series of Town Hall Meetings

Broward County Public Schools (BCPS) Board Chair Robin Bartleman, Board Members, Superintendent James F. Notter and District administrators will host a series of four town hall meetings to address the state of public education in Broward County.

The Board Chair and Superintendent will outline the financial constraints facing the District, including current budget cuts, potential future cuts and the negative economic impacts of proposed Constitutional Amendments 5, 7 and 9. They will also discuss the District's new Anti-Bullying Policy, as Broward county was the first school district in Florida to implement the policy, as aligned with new state statutes.

They will profile the District's many successes, accomplishments and awards from the 2007/08 school year, including BCPS being named a finalist for the prestigious Broad Prize for Urban Education and earning an 'A' grade from the state Department of Education for the second time in the last three years.

They will also provide a review of the School Board's Strategic Plan, which encompasses seven goal areas - student achievement, wellness, safety, innovation, employee excellence, parent involvement, business and community partnerships and environmental stewardship.

Governor Crist Calls for Task Force to Strengthen Florida's Music Recording Industry

Governor Charlie Crist, continuing his focus on strengthening Florida's economy, directed the Office of Film and Entertainment within the Governor's Office of Tourism, Trade, and Economic Development to establish a Music Recording Industry Task Force to identify issues

impacting Florida's music recording industry. The task force will also develop recommendations regarding strategies for strengthening and expanding Florida's current music recording industry.

"A rich variety of music from many cultures permeates Florida's lifestyle, with many recording artists and recording studios calling the Sunshine State home," Governor Crist said. "In the same way we have been able to attract and retain Florida businesses in other entertainment sectors, I believe we can do the same for the music industry."

Governor Crist requested that the task force place special emphasis on supporting the growth of Florida's culturally rich and diverse music industry as well as recommend strategies to achieve the following:

- Preserving our music heritage, promoting continued creativity, and assisting the state's music industry in reaching its full potential
- Identifying and promoting existing resources and establishing new ways to showcase Florida music and talent
- Protecting the entrepreneurial products created by lawful producers of sound/audio recordings
- Working with the Florida Legislature and Florida Congressional delegation to improve support to the music industry

"At Audacity Recording, we embrace Governor Crist's interest in developing Florida's diverse music industry," said Linda Thornberg of Audacity Recording in Hollywood, FL. Over our many years of being in the business, we've either composed or produced every style of music from a capella to Zydeco. I look forward to Governor Crist's Task Force to broaden the perception of Florida's music industry so we can be more inclusive of the many musical genres that Florida has to offer."

Governor Crist called on industry leaders to bring a music festival to Miami. According to the Recording Industry Association of America, a trade group that represents the United States recording industry, Florida is considered a home state for the music industry, providing 10,258 Florida jobs in the core music industry and a total of 47,911 jobs directly and indirectly related to the industry. Further, South Florida is the gateway into Latin America for Latin music produced in Florida. Four major music labels have regional offices in South Florida, with all of them basing their Latin music branches on South Beach in Miami Beach.

The Office of Film and Entertainment, directed by Lucia M. Fishburne, is tasked with developing, marketing, promoting and providing services to the state's entertainment industry, which includes the production of music videos and sound recordings, as well as motion pictures and television. To help achieve this goal, Florida currently offers an Entertainment Industry Financial Incentive Program, created within the Office of Film and Entertainment, to encourage the production of film, television, digital media and entertainment in Florida and to sustain the workforce and infrastructure for film and entertainment production. Under the incentive program, qualifying music videos may be eligible for a maximum of \$500,000 in incentive funding. Additionally, sound recording businesses also qualify for a sales tax exemption in Florida.

Florida's rich musical heritage includes many well-known past and present Florida musicians and recording artists, including Jimmy Buffet, Allman Brothers Band, Tom Petty, Lynyrd Skynyrd, Cannonball Adderley, Gloria Estefan & The Miami Sound Machine, Willy Chirino, Arturo Sandoval, "Me!" Tillis, Gamble Rogers, Will McLean, Slim Whitman, Derek Trucks, Bo Diddley, Creed, 'N' Sync, Backstreet Boys, and Vassar Clements.

The American Institute of Architects Presents “Our Ailing Communities” Author

Richard J. Jackson, public health advocate and “Our Ailing Communities” author will conduct a lecture on September 18, 7:00 p.m. at the Hollywood Central Performing Arts Center at 1770 Monroe Street in Hollywood.

Jackson’s latest book is “Urban Sprawl and Public Health” and his message, condensed simply, is “our car-dependent suburban environment is killing us.” During the presentation, the author will share data about how our environment influences our health and life-style and how we can create a sustainable future for generations to come. He advocates for an understanding of the relationships that will help us change course and create better synergies between the environment and our health in the future.

A quote from the book provides a glimpse into the message Jackson will be delivering during the lecture: “The modern America of obesity, inactivity, depression, and loss of community has not ‘happened’ to us. We legislated, subsidized, and planned it this way.”

Micro Credit Recipients Named Through Broward Cultural Division Program

Broward Cultural Division and the South Florida Regional Planning Council (SFRPC) have named Sandra Robinson and LeeAnna Yater as the first two recipients in the Artist Micro Credit Program. Each will each receive a \$5,000 loan to build their artistic businesses: *Saje Robinson Collection, Inc.* for Robinson, and an art exhibit at *Art Fusion Gallery* for Yater.

The Artist Micro Credit Program is a revolving loan program created to respond to a broad range of artists’ creative endeavors such as purchasing equipment, completing a project, or taking advantage of an opportunity. Designed to assist Broward-based practicing professional artists (of all disciplines) in advancing their careers, these loans may help with projects that are not capable of being funded from other conventional sources. On a funds-available basis, the program can provide up to \$5,000. A component of the program is

business training provided by the Artists as an Entrepreneur Institute.

The loan will assist with the launch of *Saje Robinson Collection, Inc.* - "Wearable Art" Designer T-shirts for women and men. Located at 300 E. She holds an Associate of Art degree in fashion design from the Art Institute of Fort Lauderdale.

Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport Honored for Safety Record

For the 10th consecutive year, Fort Lauderdale-Hollywood International Airport has achieved a "zero-discrepancy" in its annual Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) Certification/Safety Airport Inspection. The three-day inspection was conducted earlier this month.

The FAA inspection reviews the Airport's compliance with airfield safety requirements and is one of the most comprehensive evaluations that an airport faces from the FAA. This review concentrates on every aspect of airport safety, including runway and taxiway markings, signage, lighting, safety areas, daily inspections, staff training, airside knowledge, wildlife control, FOD (Foreign Object Debris), fueler training, emergency response, incident command and overall record management of Airport Rescue and Fire Fighter training.

Airports are certificated under Part 139, and one of the requirements is successful completion of the annual inspection by the FAA.
